

Free compost June 13-22

AmeyCespa, who run the County's waste treatment site in Waterbeach, have kindly agreed to bring us another free skip load of soil improver to help out with the replanting of our station garden tubs in June. The soil improver comes from the waste in our green bins, and from the look of the station tubs it appears to be very good at growing flowers.

The skip will be parked at Foxton Primary School from June 13-22, since the school gardeners are working on contributions for the station tubs. The idea also is to have plenty of compost left-over for anyone who'd like some for their allotment or garden. So please come along and fill up an empty bag or barrow or three. Our Headteacher Jenny Jones has liaised with the allotment group about accessing the skip over the weekend or out of school hours – so please get in touch with any of us and we'll make arrangements.

If you can use the compost to grow a little something for the station garden, or if you have a spare suitable plant that we could pop into one of the tubs that would be great. But equally, please use the compost regardless!

We have just enough people helping to look after the tubs but always need more. This involves refreshing the contents twice a year. We have free compost and I have lots of free flower and veg seed packets (courtesy of local garden centres) to distribute as well. You can then point to the tub on the platform as yours, and of course, design it as you please! We've had some lovely gestures of thanks from First Capital Connect – a wormery for the school, and some travel vouchers for people who have helped out at the station. So please do get in touch if you are at all keen.
